### Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### The Deep End – 'Keep it simple'

Jesus sends the disciples out in pairs today and the message is clear: Keep it simple. No luxury accommodation, no major appeals, no special equipment- YOU are the equipment. We may think that we can do God's work alone, but we must work together. We sometimes think that we need fancy programmes, major advertising campaigns or glossy brochures, but the message is simple. We sometimes get disheartened when we suffer rejection and are ridiculed because of our faith, but we must not let this discourage us or we lose our freedom. We can learn from rejection, shake it off and move on. The disciples are told to be part of each community they encounter, to live with the people, to spread God's message of love and compassion one person at a time.

It can seem a daunting task to say that we too are disciples sent out on mission, but it is the small acts of listening and kindness that we can bring the 'good news' of God's inclusive and unconditional love to others. Pope Francis also urges us as church to go out and to 'keep it simple': *'I prefer a church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security...I do not want a church concerned with being at the centre and then ends up by being caught up in a web of obsessions and procedures'*.

Babies are usually baptised in the first 6 months of life. To book a baptism for your child, please contact the parish priest. Parents of the child must practice their faith and registered members of the parish. At least one parent of the child needs to supply us with their **Catholic baptismal certificate** and the child's **birth certificate**. Parents and godparents must attend a baptismal preparation meeting beforehand. **The next parents' and godparents' meeting will be in the autumn.**
