JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

As *this Jubilee Year of Mercy* comes to an end, Jesus' first disciples ask what every age seems to wonder about the end of the world: "Teacher, when will that happen? What sign will there be?" (Luke 21:7). But instead of what we'd like to know, Jesus tells us what we need to know. Don't be terrified by natural disasters, human violence, personal sufferings. Because God's mercy abounds, all is grace. "It will lead to your giving testimony" (21:13). So Malachi promises "the sun of justice with its healing rays" (Mal 3:20a); and Jesus describes how we should welcome the end: "Stand erect and raise your heads, because your redemption is at hand" (Gospel Acclamation), Luke 21:28). Rather than worrying about ourselves and the future perils, both Jesus' gospel and Pope Francis' *Jubilee of Year of Mercy* bid us to go forth to spend our lives proclaiming God's promise of boundless mercy, but also translating God's mercy into living deeds of unfailing compassion and ending comfort.

Sick & Retired Priest Collection

Today we will take up a second collection for sick and retired priests of Diocese. If you took an envelope last weekend, be sure to place it in the collecting basket. If you do not have an envelope there are some available at the back of the church. Do not forget to tick off and complete the claim for Gift Aid-that adds 25 pence onto every pound you give at no cost to you. You can even fill out a standing order form if you would like, to give a little something monthly as your expression of ongoing support. The Sick and Retired Priests Fund pays things like making a flat accessible if the priest is disabled; or paying for a carer post-surgery. It can be as simple as a ride to the doctor's office for those without transport, or ensuring he has a proper nutrition. It provides funding gaps in coverages and unforeseen expenses, even though we work with social services agencies, the NHS, and local councils. Most of all, it gives peace of mind to these men who continue to live their vocation. Cardinal Nichols is committed to ensuring no retired or infirm priest is out there on his own. But he needs your prayers, support and benevolence on behalf of these men. Please be generous.

MUSINGS: 'Endure'

At some point we have all seen and heard someone shouting on the street or on the internet about the end of the world. You'd be forgiving for thinking that today's Gospel is trying to achieve the same thing. We are reading the final chapters of Luke's Gospel for Year C. Jesus is in Jerusalem and the passages we hear are talking about end times. The people gathered are obviously excited having seen how magnificent the Temple is, having come 'up from the country' and Jesus is trying to calm them down. The time for excitement might not be just yet. Jesus reminds them, and us, that these things are short-lived and we should not be too bothered about 'fine stonework' and 'votive offerings'. These things do not last.

Jesus tries to comfort the people regarding various crisis that will happen; the call is to take perspective, to look at the bigger picture. Endurance is the message of today's Gospel. The people of Jerusalem will witness the destruction of the Temple, the disciples will face persecution, people of faith will have tough times ahead. Whatever crisis may come, Jesus is affirming people to keep going, to stay focused and not be afraid.
