THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Deep End –Blessed is She

Today, the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is one of the three main feasts in the church calendar that celebrate Mary- the others are the Feast of Mary, Mother of God on 1 January and the Immaculate Conception on 8 December.

Today's feast celebrates the belief that Mary, was taken body and soul, into heaven. Yet the Gospel reading for the day recalls a much earlier time in Mary's story- Her visit to Elizabeth directly after the announcement by the angel Gabriel that she was to give birth to a son, Jesus. It depicts a joyful occasion; the excitements of the two women is palpable. Elizabeth's prayer for Mary is particularly insightful: 'Blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled'.

The Gospel reminds us that Mary's Assumption into heaven is part of a wider story, and can only be understood in his context. Because of Mary's central role in God's plan, she does not suffer the effects of sin and death- she is the first to arrive at the fullness of the redemption that her son brought for all. Today's story is a celebration of Mary's faith, and for her role in the story of salvation. Because she was so open to God's plan in the beginning, God was able to work through her and bring his salvation to all.

MUSINGS

'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the people' (Jeremiah38:4)

Telling the truth can be dangerous business: ask the prophet Jeremiah. He 'spoke truth to power', as prophets are supposed to do, and the person in power, the king, didn't like it one bit. Getting rid of the prophets seemed easier than heeding the warnings. Jeremiah was lucky to escape with his life.

Jesus knew quite a bit about the hazards of speaking the truth too. He saw John the Baptist beheaded for annoying Herod. His enemies built up quite a file of 'subversive' words had spoken by Jesus. His death on Calvary proved that his words had gotten through. Unlike Jeremiah, Jesus could not escape paying the ultimate price.

His words from today's Gospel wouldn't have helped Jesus. People in power love to see people praying for peace, rather than examining the causes of war. Jesus acknowledges that conflict is part of life, even among believers. There is no magic potion to prevent discord. Lord, Help me to speak the truth as you did, regardless of consequences.
