Missionary Zeal

Can you feel the energy and passion emanating from today's Second Reading? The Church's early missionaries-Paul, Silvanus and Timothy- are writing to the Church in Thessalonika with words of encouragement and hope. The Thessalonians were newly converted Christians, with whom Paul has spent more than few weeks. The opening of his letter, which we hear today, compliments them on their faith and perseverance, and reminds them of God's love for them. It's apt today as we celebrate Mission Sunday and reflect on the Church's mission to spread the Good News. As followers of Christ, we are tasked with passion on the message of his love. Those who has experienced God's love will want to pass this gift on to others.

The theme for this year Mission Sunday is 'That you may have life'. Paul's message to the Thessalonians is positive and life-affirming: 'We always mention you in our prayers and thank God for you all'. Appreciating others and acting with encouragement is part of our call to respect life and human dignity. When we pray for each other and help those in need, we are doing just that.

BAPTISM

At least one parent of the child needs to supply us with their **Catholic baptismal certificate and the child's birth certificate.** Parents and godparents must attend some baptism preparation beforehand.

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION
2014-2015**

An important meeting will take place for parents/guardians (and children) of First Holy Communion candidates on Wednesday **5th November 2014** at the Parish classroom at **7:00 – 8:30 pm.** Attendance of Parents/Guardians and the children to the meeting is a must!

Important Notice: A child must be baptised first before he/she is eligible to be accepted on the First Holy Communion Programme starts in November. Children applying for First Holy Communion must submit a copy of their Baptismal Certificate with the application form.
