The Deep End. 'No time like the present'

It sounds harsh – no stability or security, no time to bury your loved ones, no time to say goodbye to your family. Surely Jesus could have offered a bit of leeway to those who were willing to follow him?

Three people offer themselves as disciples, and in each case Jesus lets them know what a radical decision it is to follow him. They must cast aside their worldly worries and concerns and be single-minded in their discipleship. Following Jesus requires great sacrifice, and there are no excuses!

Take a look back over the Gospel readings from the last few Sundays. We have heard a lot about discipleship and what it involves. It is not easy. Last week Jesus spoke of discipleship as the way of the cross; this week he warns that we must leave our old lives behind and not look back. What does this mean for us – are we to literally hit the road and abandon our lives and families? I think Jesus is trying to convey the enormity of the decision we make in following him. It may not lead to a comfortable life. We must try to live by God's standards rather than our own or those of the world.

'The disciple simply burns his boat and goes ahead. He is called out... The old life is left behind, and completely surrendered. The disciple is dragged out of his relative security... out of the realm of the finite... into the realm of infinite possibilities' – *Dietrich Bonhoeffer*.

BAPTISM: To book a baptism for your child, please contact Fr. Gideon at the parish office at least 6 months before the Baptism date. Parents of the child must be registered members of the parish. At least one parent or guardian of the child needs to supply us with their Catholic Baptismal Certificate and the child's Birth Certificate. God parents **must** be practicing Catholics. Parents and god parents have to attend a meeting with the catechist or the priest before the baptism takes place.

MARRIAGE:

THE SYRIAN CONFLICT Update from CAFOD

How donations to CAFOD'S Syria appeal are now making a difference.

CAFOD would like to thank the people of the Parish for responding so generously to CAFOD'S Syria appeal during Lent. They received £1,483,139 from across the Catholic community of England and Wales.

As we all know from media coverage, the humanitarian situation in Syria is catastrophic and continues to deteriorate. The UN estimates that 6.8 million people in Syria are in urgent need of aid, and more than 5 million people have been forced out of their homes. Because of the fighting, it is difficult to deliver humanitarian aid in many parts of Syria.

Meanwhile, a further 1.6 million people have fled into neighbouring countries and the numbers are increasing rapidly. The people from Lebanon, Jordan and Turkey have shown great compassion in welcoming Syrians but the sheer number is putting an enormous strain on already overstretched resources.

Because of security issues on the ground CAFOD cannot communicate details of the specific programmes that they are supporting. But what they can say is that they are working with trusted Church partners in Syria who are providing food parcels, medical aid and relief supplies, and helping people to find safe places to stay. CAFOD is also working in Lebanon, Turkey and Jordan to help the refugees.

Your prayers are needed:

Please continue to pray for the people of Syria and for CAFOD's local partners who are working to alleviate their suffering.

"Let us pray for the people of Syria. May they find in us, their brothers and sisters, the compassionate hand of Christ and may they be given the support they need to look to the future with hope and renewed faith. Lord, hear us!"
