The Deep End. “Martha Ministers eh?”

Mary and Martha are stressed out with all the work they have to do. Jesus has arrived, probably with an entourage who are no doubt hungry. This small passage has created much interest from biblical scholars over the years. For some, it suggests that Jesus is favouring prayer and reflection over action. For others, it justifies the role of women in the church as concerned with hospitality. Many would disagree, and see Mary's place at Jesus' feet as a clear sign of a disciple learning from their teacher. Luke places a special emphasis in his Gospel on the wider circle of Jesus' disciples, and name the women who followed him.

Luke also uses a specific word to refer to the 'many tasks' that Martha was concerned about: *diakonia* – a word that he uses elsewhere in Luke and Acts to refer to ministry and service in a community. It is from this word that we get the word 'deacon'. Whatever interpretation we want to make, this is a beautiful passage about service, the importance of prayer, discipleship and ministry in all its forms.

When we are so bogged down in the craziness around us, Jesus is clear about the way forward. First, sit and listen to him. This is good advice. Then we may be better prepared for the challenges that we face, whether they be in our homes or our wider communities.

QUESTIONS PEOPLE ASK @intercom

Q. Saint Paul wrote that he opposed Peter in public because he was clearly wrong (Gal 2:11). If Scripture says that the first pope, Peter, was clearly wrong, how can Catholics say that the people is infallible?

A. Their disagreement was regarding Peter's policy of not eating with Gentiles lest it offend the sensibility of Jewish Christians, although he accepted their equality. We read Paul's version of their meeting but I'd love to hear Peter's side of the story. Paul was confrontational in his approach, which isn't always the best policy. It landed him in trouble in Damascus and, later, in Rome. Peter was more sensitive and diplomatic in dealing with people and their sensitivities. The matter had nothing to do with infallibility.

THE SYRIAN CONFLICT Update from CAFOD

How donations to CAFOD'S Syria appeal are now making a difference.

CAFOD would like to thank the people of the Parish for responding so generously to CAFOD's Syria appeal during Lent. They received £1,483,139 from across the Catholic community of England and Wales.

As we all know from media coverage, the humanitarian situation in Syria is catastrophic and continues to deteriorate. The UN estimates that 6.8 million people in Syria are in urgent need of aid, and more than 5 million people have been forced out of their homes. Because of the fighting, it is difficult to deliver humanitarian aid in many parts of Syria.

Meanwhile, a further 1.6 million people have fled into neighbouring countries and the numbers are increasing rapidly. The people from Lebanon, Jordan and Turkey have shown great compassion in welcoming Syrians but the sheer number is putting an enormous strain on already overstretched resources.

Because of security issues on the ground CAFOD cannot communicate details of the specific programmes that they are supporting. But what they can say is that they are working with trusted Church partners in Syria who are providing food parcels, medical aid and relief supplies, and helping people to find safe places to stay. CAFOD is also working in Lebanon, Turkey and Jordan to help the refugees.
