The Deep End. "My freezer is too full"

Do an internet search for 'middle class problems' or 'first world problems', and you'll find lists of complaints about just how challenging modern life can be. There are gems such as 'I can't believe I bought a toaster with no bagel setting'; 'Had to turn down the brightness on the iPad because it hurt my eyes'; or 'My freezer is too full and stuff falls out every time I open it'.

They are tongue in cheek, of course, but they do highlight our tendency to worry about material things, and to forget what is important. Most of us do tend to accumulate possessions over time. Many of us like to have the latest phone or laptop, furniture, clothes or car. The character in today's Gospel had such a good harvest of crops that he ran out of space. He built bigger barns and then sat back to 'eat, drink, have a good time' – a phrase which is often translated into the popular expression 'eat, drink and be merry!' Yet things did not go according to plan.

Today's readings offer us an opportunity to examine our relationship with possessions. The Vikings believed you could take riches with you when you died, and filled boats with treasures to take into the afterlife. We know that we come into this world with nothing and leave with nothing. Rather than collecting riches for ourselves, our thoughts should be on 'heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth'. What treasures are important to us? *T.Doherty@Intercom*

**Holy Ghost Fathers originally called
The Spiritans
Sunday 11th August 2013**

Who are they?

They are a Roman Catholic Religious Congregation founded in 1703. Over 300 years on, over 300 professed and lay Spiritans, drawn from all continents of the world, carry out, today their mission of evangelisation in more than 60 countries throughout the world.

Spiritans life in the UK- The establishment of the congregation in England was in 1904 in the diocese of Clifton, where they experienced a growth in vocations. Most of their priests were posted to missions in Sierra Leone, Nigeria and East Africa. Today the Spiritans in the UK continues to experience growth and renewal with the mission appointments here from other provinces of the Congregation. It has enjoyed great missionary successes and expansion in Britain and overseas, and has maintained an international and missionary flavour to its works.

What is their mission?

Their mission is the evangelisation of the "poor" (cf. Luke 4:18). Therefore, they as Spiritans go especially:

- to peoples and individuals who have not yet heard the message of the Gospel or who have scarcely heard it.
- to those whose needs are the greatest, and to the oppressed.
- they willingly accept tasks for which the Church has difficulty in finding workers.

Today British Spiritans continue to work in 9 overseas missions: Australia, South Africa, Kenya, Nigeria, Ghana, USA, Tanzania, and Rome. The Spiritan missionary outreach and ministries have been a seed bed of exciting developments in all these part of the world.
