### The Deep End. "Dressed for action"

It sometimes takes a major disaster to put the spotlight on the ever-ready nature of the emergency services. The aftermath of the recent Boston Marathon bombings showed how quickly paramedics, doctors and emergency medical staff can spring into action to aid people in distress. When on call, fire-fighters and paramedics are 'dressed for action', ready to run when the call comes.

Jesus talked to his disciples about being 'dressed for action'. He told the disciples to 'have their lamps lit', and to be awake when the master comes – just like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding feast.

How can we 'dress for action', so that we are ready when Jesus calls us from this life? We do not have the luxury of knowing when that day will come. It can be easy to fall into the trap of thinking 'My master is taking his time coming' and postponing our good behaviour for another time. If we knew when our time was going to be up, we could arrange our lives accordingly – culminating perhaps in a dramatic death-bed confession and conversion! **Holy Ghost Fathers originally called  
The Spiritans  
Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> August 2013**

**Who are they?**

They are a Roman Catholic Religious Congregation founded in 1703. Over 300 years on, over 300 professed and lay Spiritans, drawn from all continents of the world, carry out, today their mission of evangelisation in more than 60 countries throughout the world.

**Spiritans life in the UK-** The establishment of the congregation in England was in 1904 in the diocese of Clifton, where they experienced a growth in vocations. Most of their priests were posted to missions in Sierra Leone, Nigeria and East Africa.

Today the Spiritans in the UK continues to experience growth and renewal with the mission appointments here from other provinces of the Congregation. It has enjoyed great missionary successes and expansion in Britain and overseas, and has maintained an international and missionary flavour to its works.

**What is their mission?**

Their mission is the evangelisation of the poor" (cf. Luke 4:18). Therefore, they as Spiritans go especially:

- to peoples and individuals who have not yet heard the message of the Gospel or who have scarcely heard it.
- to those whose needs are the greatest, and to the oppressed.
- they willingly accept tasks for which the Church has difficulty in finding workers.

Today British Spiritans continue to work in 9 overseas missions: Australia, South Africa, Kenya, Nigeria, Ghana, USA, Tanzania, and Rome. The Spiritan missionary outreach and ministries have been a seed bed of exciting developments in all these part of the world.
