Fourth Sunday of Advent - The Nativity of The Lord 24th & 25th December 2017

The Deep End – 'Glory to God in the highest heaven!' @Intercom

Tonight we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord. This account of his birth from Luke show Jesus being born into a situation of total oppression. Luke reminds us of the political regime which controls the land and the effect this has on the people. Mary must still travel to Bethlehem even though she is about to give birth. The shepherds, found only in Luke's account, are social outcasts due to their profession. It is not a romantic or tranquil setting as the shepherds would have suffered all kinds of deprivations and dangers. Everything about this story is provocative and uneasy. Into this 'mess' God is born; this Saviour, the Lord, a homeless child, is one who will turn the situation of people upside down, who promises release to captives and sight to the blind. The angels rejoice with the shepherds, the 'highest' and the 'lowest'. The poor and marginalised will be the first to experience the abundance of God's hospitality and the shepherds come in their name.

We are invited to Bethlehem today, to open up our hearts to the One who has come. We return, like the shepherds *'glorifying and praising God for all they have seen and heard'*. May we welcome all as God does, with compassion and love. Shalom.

BAPTISM

Babies are usually baptised in the first **6 months** after birth. To book a baptism for your child, please contact the parish office. Parents of the child must practice their faith and registered members of the parish. At least one parent of the child and the godparent must supply us with their **Catholic baptismal certificate** and the **child's birth certificate**. Parents and godparents **must** attend a baptismal preparation meeting beforehand.

The next preparation course for Baptism will take place in the parish at 7:00 pm on Monday 8th and Friday 12th January 2018. Parents and godparents need to attend both days.

In order to make the most of the meeting, we would like to recommend, leave the children at home, having them might be distracting for you and other attendants

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPELS Luke1:26-38

1. We are all favoured ones and God is with us. Sometimes we are more aware of this than others. How have you experienced being a favoured person, one blessed by God? How have you experienced God's presence? Who has been Gabriel to you-a messenger of Good news?

2. 'Do not be afraid'. Mary was perplexed by the words of the angel. Perhaps you too have sometimes been perplexed by life's path and wondered what it all meant. Perhaps at times you have doubted if God was really with you. In your troubled moments who has been an 'angel' helping to lower your anxiety?

3. Mary was taken by surprise by the invitation, but she did not tell the angel she was not ready, nor ask him to return later. She was prepared to go with the invitation even though it was not the 'right moment'. 'Here I am Lord' What invitations have come to you at the 'wrong time' and how have you responded?

4. Mary's response serves as a model for us-she is one who says 'yes' to what life offers. What is it like for you to say 'yes' to life? Perhaps at this moment in your life you are being invited to say 'Here I am Lord'?
