Fourth Sunday of Easter

'The Deep End – Shepherd who smell of their sheep

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, so named because of the excerpt from the Gospel of John in which Jesus speaks about himself as the 'good shepherd'. It is also known as a day of prayer for vocations. What makes a good shepherd John tells us that the good shepherd is willing to lay down his life for his sheep. The shepherd is at the service of his sheep. Above all, he knows his own sheep. What a simple yet profound model for those with leadership roles in our church, and indeed for all of us.

Pope Francis used quite a vivid image in this context a while back, calling on priests to be 'shepherd with the smell of sheep'. In *the Joy of the Gospel*, he places this responsibility on all of us: 'Each Christian and every community...all of us are asked to obey his call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the "peripheries"'. We cannot be at the service of the people unless we know them, spend time with them and understand where they are coming from. We must be willing to serve, wherever help is needed.

A good shepherd does not remain indoors, watching from afar, hoping everything will be okay with his flock. He must be out among them in order to be able to protect and help them.
